Newport, the 'Capital' of the Isle of Wight, provides visitors with not only, all the facilities of a large market town but also a fascinating and varied history.

The leading tourist attraction, Carisbrooke Castle, one of the best preserved castles in Southern England, was built by the Normans as a Fortress against the invading French and Spanish and later was the prison for Charles I in 1648 now gracefully overlooks the Island's busiest town.

Because the harbour is well sheltered and centrally positioned in the South it became a highly successful trading port in the 17th and 18th Century known as 'new port'.



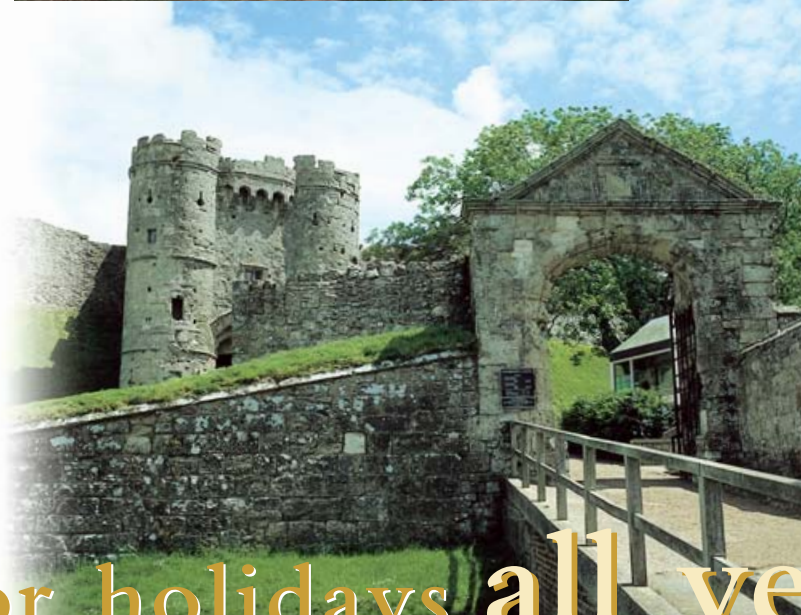
**Local transport**

**Your hotel bedroom...**

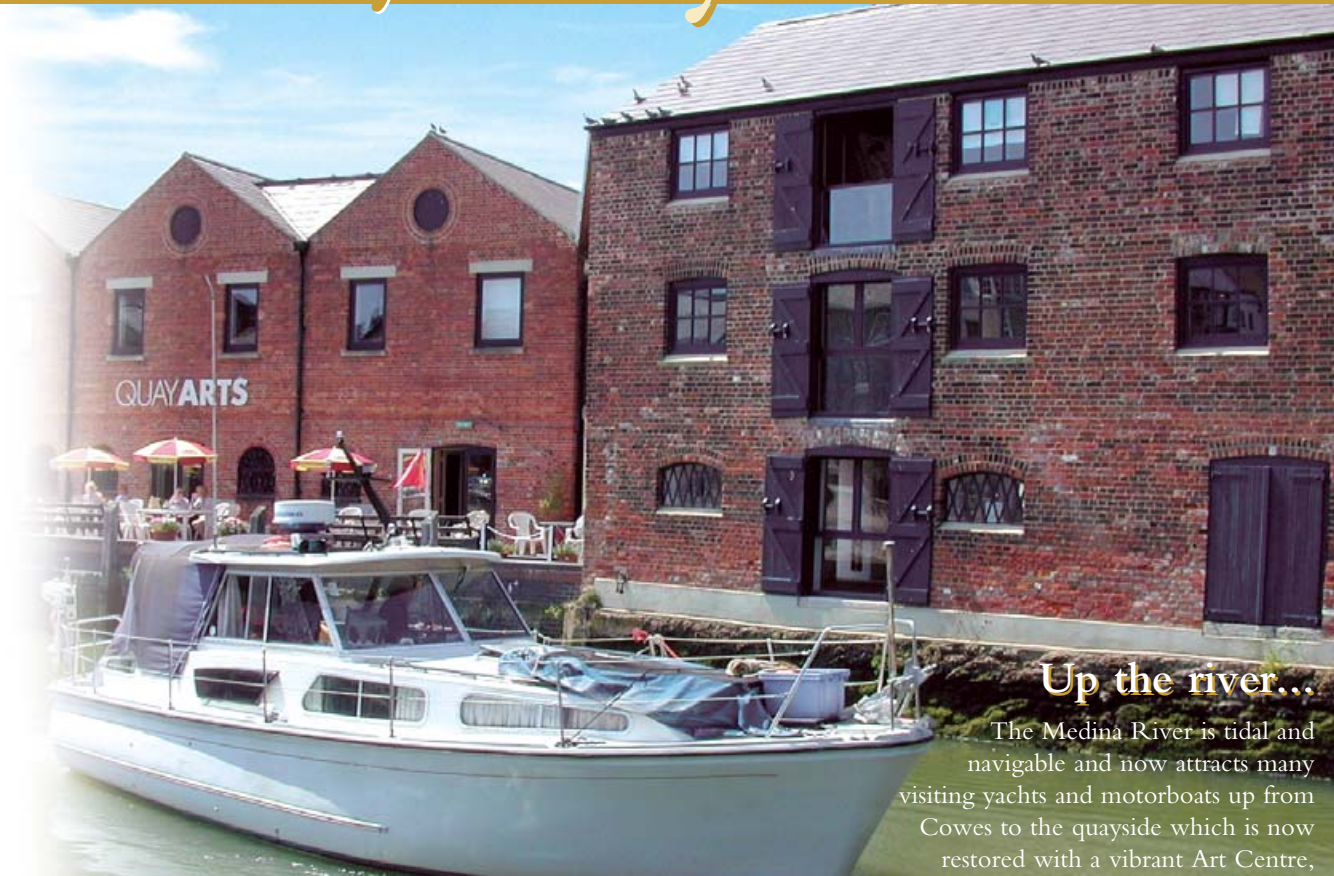
The Hotel has a range of singles, twins and double bedrooms. All rooms are en-suite and all have TV's, and tea / coffee making facilities.
